Campus Safety and Security Weekly Campus Crime Report

On Campus

Theft from Building – *3100 Wyman Park Drive* – Between August 21st at 4:45 PM and August 25th at 8:00 AM, a JHU Staff member reported that her Air Purifier was missing from her desk. After a check with co-workers and the area, the Purifier could not be found. Investigation continuing.

Off Campus

Theft from Auto – *810 Wyman Park Drive (rear parking lot of Stieff Building)* – On August 24th between 8:30 AM and 5:00 PM, the driver's side window of an employee's vehicle was broken and the GPS navigation system device stolen. Investigation continuing.

ARREST - CCTV Observation (Attempt Theft) – *Unit Block of University Parkway, Interfaith Bike Rack* – On August 27th at 9:44 AM, an unknown non-affiliate was observed on CCTV attempting to cut a cable lock off a bike secured to the bike rack. The information was broadcasted by security dispatch and Baltimore Police responded catching the suspect in the act trying to steal a bike. The suspect was taken into custody. Further investigation revealed that the suspect was also responsible for the theft of a bike on August 5th 2009 from the same bike rack. Search incident to the arrest produced a bolt cutter and mini hacksaw from the suspect. Investigation is continuing to determine if this suspect is responsible for other area bike thefts.
