Safety Tip of the week:

Every year, winter storms leave carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning deaths in their path. As winter's coldest months arrive, with temperatures in some parts of the United States dipping below freezing, January and February are prime months for winter weather-related power outages. Tragically people are dying from carbon monoxide poisoning while trying to keep warm. Carbon monoxide is an odorless and colorless poisonous gas. CPSC estimates about 140 people die each year from unintentional exposure to carbon monoxide associated with consumer products "Don't let this invisible killer into your home."

- Never use portable generators inside homes or garages, even if doors and windows are open. Use generators outside only, far away from the home.
- Never bring a charcoal grill into the house for heating or cooking. Do not barbeque in the garage.
- Never use a gas range or oven for heating. Open the fireplace damper before lighting a fire and keep it open until the ashes are cool. An open damper may help prevent build-up of poisonous gases inside the home.
- Have home heating systems (including chimneys and vents) inspected and serviced annually by a trained service technician. Install battery-operated CO alarms or CO alarms with battery backup in your home outside separate sleeping areas.
- Know the symptoms of carbon monoxide poisoning: headache, dizziness, weakness, nausea, vomiting, sleepiness, and confusion.
- If you suspect CO poisoning, get outside to fresh air immediately, and then call 911.

Burglary – 205 E. 30th St. — Between Dec. 21st at 11:00 PM, and Dec. 22nd at 7:00 AM, a JHMI medical student reported when he awakened, he discovered the top sash of his kitchen window open (down), and his laptop was missing off of his desk. The student had been asleep

and heard nothing during the night. The apartment was checked and no other items were missing. Baltimore City Police responded previously. This incident was reported at 10:20 AM.

ARREST – Burglary – 3100 Blk. N. Calvert St. – On Dec. 27th at 11:38 PM, Baltimore Police, campus officers and an off-duty Baltimore Police officer working for JHU responded for a burglary in progress at a non-affiliate’s third floor apartment. An Allied Barton patrol officer observed a suspect emerging from a nearby alley; campus officers detained the suspect until Baltimore Police arrived and he was positively identified as the burglar. The complainant was unharmed. Investigation is continuing into this suspect’s possible involvement in other burglaries in the area.

Burglary – 2900 Blk. N. Charles St. (odd-numbered side) – Between Dec. 26th at 4:30 PM and Dec. 27th at 2:55 AM, a Timberland backpack was taken from a non-affiliate’s residence. Entry had been gained by removing a window grate from a ground-level front window. Baltimore Police responded. Investigation continuing.
