

Get an Anonymous Crime Watch Number

What is a Crime Watch number?

A Crime Watch number, also known as a “Block Watch” number, is a unique, seven-digit number issued to you by the Baltimore Police Department. It is a confidential identification number that you give to the 9-1-1 Operator after dialing “9-1-1” to make sure that the police officer responding to your call does not come to your door. Once you give your Crime Watch number to the 9-1-1 Operator, your name, phone number and address will not be given to the police and the police officer in the responding patrol car will not know who made the 9-1-1 call or the phone number or address that it came from.

How do I get a Crime Watch Number?

You can get a Crime Watch Number three ways.

1. Contact the Community Relations officers of [your local police district](#).
2. Contact Operation Crime Watch at (443) 984-2371 or (443) 984-2372 extension #2372.
3. Apply on line by visiting the [Crime Watch Number Application Page](#)

You must supply your name, address and telephone number to receive a Crime Watch number. You should receive your number in the mail in a week.

ARREST - Burglary – 3509 N. Charles St. - Bunting – Meyerhoff – (2nd Floor) - On Feb 9th at 5:35 PM, Campus Officers responded for an alarm activation. Upon arrival they discovered a male suspect lying on the floor in the organ area. When questioned, the suspect stated that he was homeless and entered the building by the elevator. The suspect was searched and was in possession of a screwdriver and one syringe with residue. Investigation revealed that the suspect took and ate a juice bar and Klondike bar from the ice cream freezer on the first floor. Further investigation determined that the suspect entered the building through the front door, which was
