## Baltimore Police Identify 'Wanted' Suspects

Baltimore police released a new list Monday of some of the city's most wanted suspects, and they said they plan to do so every week using technology.

Mayor Stephanie Rawlings-Blake said she wants city police to use Twitter, Facebook and the service [Nixle.com](http://Nixle.com) to catch the city's most wanted criminals with the help of the public.

"We are using the 20,000 or so people who are signed up to use Nixle as extra eyes and ears in the community," said police spokesman Anthony Guglielmi. Police said the alerts will be sent out every Monday and that the warrant apprehension task force comes up with the list.

"They have a checklist of how to go after people. Once it reaches a certain point, if they're unsuccessful, they seek the public's assistance. These people have been vetted by the police and investigated and identified to put up as most wanted," Guglielmi said.

"If you get this text message, it's not a name. You're getting and a picture that you can look at, and if you're in the barbershop or hair salon and someone comes along, you have this picture right there," Rawlings-Blake said.

She said viewers will eventually be able to see who is wreaking havoc in their neighborhood when the program goes geocentric.

"If you live in the Eastern District, we will send you people in your community that police are looking for," the mayor said. Police stressed that you should call 911 and not go after the people by yourself.
