Another Homicide in the District:

Howard & 25th Streets

On March 15, 2010 at approx. 6:44 pm an unidentified man was shot in the area of Howard and 25th Streets. The unidentified man died as a result of being shot while he was sitting inside of a vehicle. The victim is not a resident of the district. The suspects in this incident allegedly fired shots from an unidentified silver vehicle. According to my sources within the BPD it is too early to determine if this incident is related to the incident from Friday at Calvert & 26th Streets. At this time there is a limited amount of information. As it becomes available it will be disseminated accordingly.

Homicide – 2600 blk. Calvert St. 3/12/10 4:20 pm

The victim was shot and fatally wounded by an unknown suspect. Investigation is on-going.

Shooting – 2600 blk. Greenmount Ave 3/7/10 1:00 am

The victim was walking when he heard several shots fired. The victim realized that an unknown suspect shot him in the ankle.

Armed Robbery (Commercial) – 200 blk. W. 28TH St. 3/8/10 2:40 am

Property Taken: \$240, Black Apple iPod (16GB)

Unknown suspects walked into the store and pointed a black revolver at the clerks. Suspect #1 ordered the clerks to open change machine and register. The suspects removed the currency and property and fled.
