

Trash Rules: A quick reminder



1. By law, trash must be placed in a trash can with a lid and may only be put in the designated spot for your building on trash day. For most buildings, cans are put out in the alley directly behind your building.

2. Landlords are responsible for providing sufficient trash cans for the tenants in their buildings. However, tenants are also responsible for abiding by all sanitation rules and many be cited individually by the City.

3. Put your garbage out no earlier the morning of the day of pick-up.

4. You are required by law to clean up the feces when you take your dog out. The fine for disobeying this ordinance is \$60!

Pick-up days:

Trash, North of 27 th and N side of Lorraine Ave between Guilford and Barclay	Tuesday and Friday
Trash, South of 27 th Street	Wednesday and Saturday
Bulk Trash	4 th Monday of the month
Single Stream Recycling	2 nd and 4 th Wednesday

Recycling:

- The City of Baltimore now has Single Stream Recycling: all recyclables may be put in the same container and are picked up on the same day.
- Recyclables include: glass bottles, plastic bottles (#1 thru #7), and tin, aluminum and steel cans, cardboard and paper
- You may put recyclables in either the official yellow City recycling bin or any container clearly marked “recycling”
- You may also drop-off recyclables at the Sisson Street Transfer Station located at 2840 Sisson Street.
 - ◇ Fall and Winter hours: 9-5 Mon-Sat;
 - ◇ Spring and Summer hours: 9-7 Mon-Sat

Bulk Trash:

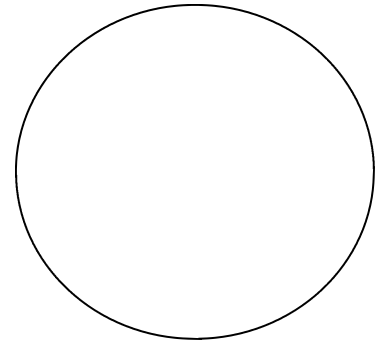
- Furniture, mattresses, and large appliances such as a stove or refrigerator
- Pick-up is the 4th Monday of the month for most of the CVCBD
- You must call 311 at least three business days in advance to inform them that you need a bulk pick-up
- Pick-up at the same spot as your regular trash
- Put out up to three items at a time

The Charles Village Community Benefits District (CVCBD) comprises a 100-block area in north-Central Baltimore. It boasts a population exceeding 14,000 residents, has more than 700 businesses, and is home to four distinct neighborhoods: **Abell, Charles Village, Harwood, and Old Goucher**. It also includes parts of the **Barclay, Remington** and **Waverly** neighborhoods.

The CVCBD promotes and markets the District and provides supplemental sanitation and safety services. A community-based Board of Directors oversees and guides the organization. Property owners currently pay a tax surcharge of 12 cents per \$100 of assessed property value to help fund CVCBD services and publications.

Our Clean Team supplements city services by being out in the District every day cleaning sidewalks, alleys, street gutters, storm drains, & tree wells maintaining and emptying over 75 trash baskets throughout the District, including weekend service removing & disposing of bulk trash and debris from our alleys responding to special service requests from residents and for community events

Our Safety Team supplements city services by being out in the District every day patrolling the District; providing a uniformed presence as our neighborhood *eyes & ears* educating District businesses & neighbors on city ordinances, coordinating with the CVCBD Clean Team providing security presence for District meetings and events

Our Outreach and Communications program Produces regular publications such as our newsletter, the *District Bulletin*, and our weekly *Crime Alerts* helps to organize and support community-based activities such as Neighborhood Walkers On Patrol, National Night Out Against Crime, and the Mayor's Spring and Fall Cleanups works with city to track & ensure enforcement of sanitation & safety codes – call us & 311
