Safety in Your Vehicle

The crime of “carjacking” – which is stealing a car by force – captures headlines across the country. Statistically speaking, however, your chances of being a victim of carjacking are very slim, and taking preventive measures can reduce that risk even more.

If your vehicle is “bumped” by another vehicle from the rear, do not immediately get out of your vehicle. Stop and assess the situation while calling 911. Keep your doors locked and windows up. Until police arrive or circumstances change.

[Baltimore Police On-line Reporting for Non-Violent Crime](#)

The system allows Baltimore crime victims to file reports on-line for non-violent incidents such as car break-ins, vandalism and illegal dumping. Reports can also be filed on various platforms including a computer, tablet or smart phone. All the user has to do is go to the city police website, and click the reporting link and follow instructions. Each report is assigned an incident number, and the user gets a PDF file of their report that can also be used to report loss for insurance.

If the carjacker threatens you with a gun or other weapon, give up your car. Don't argue. Your life is definitely worth more than a car.

If you sense any danger get away from the area as quickly as possible.

Try to remember what the carjacker looked like—gender, race, age, hair and eye color, special features, clothes.

Take a picture of your registration card so the information can be correctly relayed to the police if your vehicle is carjacked.
